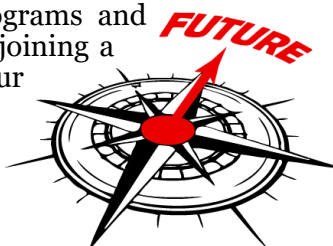

Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program

The Pennsylvania LIHEAP program offers heating assistance for income-eligible households. For the 2024-2025 season, households of 1 qualify with annual incomes up to \$22,590, and 2-person households qualify up to \$30,660. **Emergency crisis grants are also available for heating system breakdowns, fuel shortages, or shutoff threats.** Assistance is provided promptly, often within 10 days. Applications are open from November 4, 2024, to April 4, 2025. Applications are available here at the Northeastern Senior Center, or you can apply online or stop in at the county assistance office and they will help you fill out the application.

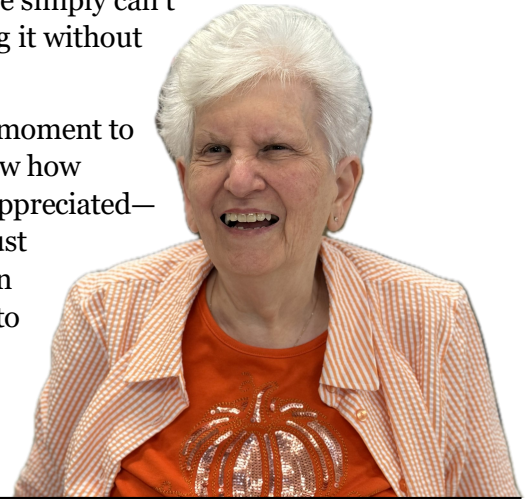
# In the Spotlight



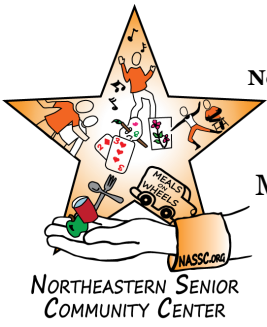
